Dear Doctor,

If your patient requires epidural steroid injections (ESI) you will need to discontinue their anticoagulant, <u>ONLY IF IT IS SAFE TO DO SO</u>, prior to their treatments.

Patients are often anticoagulated on:

- clopidogrel (Plavix) stop 7 days
- ticagrelor (Brilinta) stop 7 days
- warfarin (Coumadin) stop 5 days
- apixaban (Eliquis) stop 4 days
- rivaroxaban (Xerelto) stop 3 days

If bridging therapy with low molecular weight heparin (e.g. Dalteparin) is required please arrange for a prescription for your patient to cover once-weekly ESI's for three weeks, after which the patient should be instructed to resume their anticoagulant.

Once the above had been arranged, the patient should contact my office and plan for three consecutive once-weekly appointments for their ESI's.
